Online learning is the most common form of distance learning, but over 60% of households in low and lower-middle income countries don't have access to Internet.

A CRISIS WITHIN **CRISIS**



13 of the 16 countries classified as experiencing high-or medium-intensity conflict have announced nationwide school closures. Both boys and girls in fragile and conflict-affected states may face additional risks as schools close, including increased susceptibility to child labour, sexual exploitation, and recruitment to armed groups.

Right now, 111 million girls are at risk. In the world's least-developed countries, school closures lead to increased risk of

sexual and physical abuse for girls.

Due to COVID-19, more girls are at risk than there are people in all of California, Texas, New York, and Florida combined.
